



CIRTL Network Exchange Program

What is the CIRTL Network Exchange Program?	The CIRTL Network Exchange Program is a two to three day visit to a host campus within the Network. The program is designed to give applicants the opportunity to give a Teaching-as-Research colloquium and interact with disciplinary colleagues at the CIRTL Network institution. Participants also have the opportunity to practice professional skills before entering the job market.
Who is eligible to apply?	Graduate students and post doctoral researchers in science, technology, engineering or mathematics disciplines at CIRTL Network Institutions are eligible to apply for the CIRTL Network Exchange program. The primary eligibility requirement is the applicant's readiness to give a high quality presentation on his or her teaching-as-research study.
What are the program requirements?	Accepted program participants are required to: (see program website for more details) <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Work with local CIRTL contacts at the home and host campus to coordinate the visit and presentations.2. Present a teaching-as-research talk at the host campus.3. Present on or discuss professional research in their field.4. Lead a discussion or forum on teaching-as-research at their home campus after their visit.5. Post a summary of their visit on the CIRTL Café.
Where does program support come from?	The CIRTL Network Exchange is a program of the Center for the Integration of Research, Teaching and Learning (CIRTL) Network. CIRTL is supported by a grant from the National Science Foundation. Participant travel expenses will be paid by the home campus CIRTL office.
